

Worship Notes St. Titus, Pastor and Confessor – January 25 & 26, 2025

We welcome our members and guests who are worshiping with us today, and pray God's rich blessings upon you during this time of worship!

THEME

Today's worship focuses not so much on Titus, but the role of the pastor. Pastors are called not to be successful as the world counts success but to "pursue righteousness, godliness, faith, love, steadfastness, gentleness," to "fight the good fight of the faith," and to feed the flock of God the true food of Word and Sacrament. Faith-filled overseers of the flock are vigilant in care—gracious stewards of God's Law and Gospel counsel; attentive stewards of God's abundant grace—a vital treasure for believers. And these appointed laborers of Christ need to remain strong in godly virtue and order, equipped to battle fierce wolves and subtle evil that mingle in the lives of God's people. Amid striving evil and genuine need, pastors and confessors proclaim that the kingdom of God comes near.

HYMN OF THE DAY:


Our *Hymn of the Day* this weekend, *Preach You the Word and Plant It Home*, is found in the section of our hymnal that focuses on the Word of God. This remarkable hymn was written in 1973 by Martin Franzmann (1907-76) to commemorate the 125th anniversary of Concordia Theological Seminary, Springfield, Illinois (*which later moved to Fort Wayne*). It was first sung at an "Evening of Christian Poetry and Hymnody" for seminary faculty, administrators, and their families.

The text resonates with numerous scriptural allusions *and* direct quotations, weaving together Jesus' parable of the sower (*Matthew 13:3-23*) with prophetic and apostolic admonitions to those who preach the living Word of God. The 17th century German tune is also used for the Advent hymn, *O Savior, Rend the Heavens Wide*.

- **L** In the name of the Father and of the


 → Son and of the Holy Spirit.



Epistle Titus 1:1-9

The attributes of a pastor.

¹Paul, a servant of God and an apostle of Jesus Christ, for the sake of the faith of God's elect and their knowledge of the truth, which accords with godliness, ²in hope of eternal life, which God, who never lies, promised before the ages began ³ and at the proper time manifested in his word through the preaching with which I have been entrusted by the command of God our Savior; ⁴To Titus, my true child in a common faith: Grace and peace from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Savior.

⁵This is why I left you in Crete, so that you might put what remained into order, and appoint elders in every town as I directed you — ⁶if anyone is above reproach, the husband of one wife, and his children are believers and not open to the charge of debauchery or insubordination. ⁷For an overseer, as God's steward, must be above reproach. He must not be arrogant or quick-tempered or a drunkard or violent or greedy for gain, ⁸but hospitable, a lover of good, self-controlled, upright, holy, and disciplined. ⁹He must hold firm to the trustworthy word as taught, so that he may be able to give instruction in sound doctrine and also to rebuke those who contradict it.

The Lord sends out the Seventy-Two.






