FROM THE PASTOR

“I was glad when they said to me, “Let us go to the house of the Lord!”—Psalm 122:1

There is a pop song that includes the line, “You’re gonna miss me when I’m gone...” And while the words of the song may refer to the missing of a dear friend or loved one...have you ever thought about what your life would be like if you were prevented from attending Sunday worship? Would you miss it?



Worship is important in our lives. For some it is new and fresh and each encounter is a brand new experience; the toddler who at the communion rail echoes the “amen” at the communicants’ dismissal or maybe they too hold out their hands to receive, watching as mom and dad take and eat. For others, regular Sunday worship is a distant memory; but those memories continue to be recalled when the pastor visits bedside. The elderly member debilitated by age and memory loss, who struggles to speak clearly but still hums along to every familiar hymn that the pastor sings.

From the youngest to the oldest, from the greatest to the least, our worship life is important, and as David shares in his psalm, there is a gladness that comes from going to the house of the Lord. From the toddler gladly and spontaneously vocalizing the “amen,” to a bedridden member who fondly remembers those old hymns of her youth, there is a joy that comes in worship. Most of us are probably somewhere in between. Small children being taught the faith and learning the habit of worship. Young folks in the military or college students away from home, struggling with what they have been taught over against the freedom to choose for themselves. Parents and their struggles to keep kids of whatever age coming to church, amidst the enticement of weekend sports and activities, or the endless question of “Do I have to go to church?” Older adults experiencing the sunset years of life and while the heart wants to be in the house of the Lord, the body isn’t cooperating; steps are sometimes unsure and hands shake, and there is the wondering of just how long? No matter where we are in our worship life, coming to the house of the Lord is important.

My father once commented regarding the loss of his own father, that what he missed most was that he couldn’t just call him up and talk. Thoughts like this make the line of the song, “You’re gonna miss me when I’m gone...” all the more poignant. How would you feel if you could no longer come to worship? What would you miss? What do you miss when you are absent from the house of the Lord?

King David in the whole of Psalm 122 gives a picture of what is found in the House of the Lord. Peace, Security, Goodness. Now we understand why David can begin this psalm with such a joy-filled statement, **“I was glad when they said to me, ‘Let us go to the house of the Lord!’”**

We too can endorse such a statement, because in Christ-centered worship, in Word and Sacrament, we receive what we so desperately need—the forgiveness of our sins and strengthening of our faith. With King David, we too have peace, security and goodness and joyously can echo, **“I was glad when they said to me, ‘Let us go to the house of the Lord!’”—Psalm 122:1**

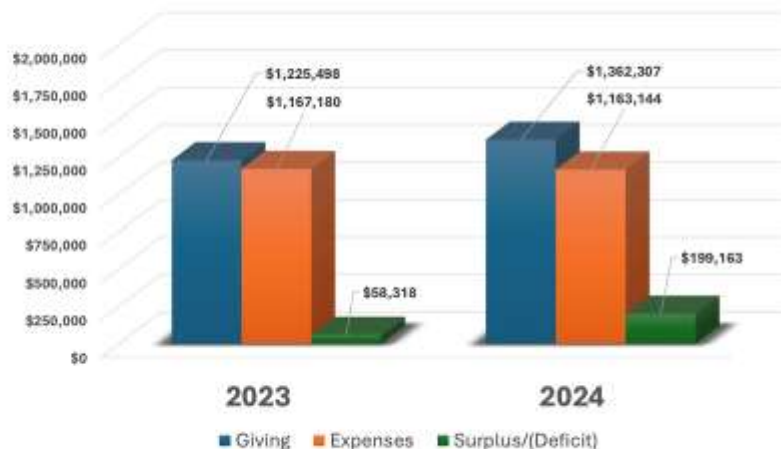

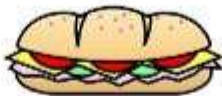
