Worship Notes Fourth Sunday after Epiphany – February 1 & 2, 2025

We welcome our members and guests who are worshiping with us today, and pray God's rich blessings upon you during this time of worship!

THEME

Apart from God, we know not how to speak. And yet in His dominion, embryos are deemed to be prophets before birth – equipped in life to proclaim the deliverance of our God without fear armed with God's truth that destroys, redeems, and restores nations and kingdoms. Yet the greatest prophet, with unrivaled authority, is Jesus. His proclamations cast out our demons, rebuke fever, heal disease, and preach the Good News. His Word alone empowers the Church and her people to speak truth.

HYMN OF THE DAY

Our *Hymn of the Day* this weekend, *Son of God, Eternal Savior*, was written by Somerset T. C. Lowry (1855-1932). The hymn, originally 5 stanzas, was first published in 1894 in an issue of the periodical, *Good Will*, then in the *Christian Social Union Hymn Book* in 1895.

Over the years there have been slight alterations to his text, most notably "Word made flesh" being substituted for the original "Son of man" in the first and last stanzas then totally omitting Lowry's fourth stanza.

The tune, IN BABILONE, is an ingratiating Dutch tune used for a number of hymns over the years, including *Holy Spirit, Ever Dwelling* in this hymnal. The tune origins are from 1710, found in a collection of old and new Dutch peasant songs and country dances. The collection came to the attention of Ralph Vaughan Williams, who recognized the merit of this tune and first used it for the tune to the hymn, *See the Conqueror Mounts in Triumph*.

The current setting was done by Henry V. Gerike, an alteration of the previous setting by Carl Schalk.

What our Church Believes, Teaches and and Confesses regarding The Lord's Supper

The Bible teaches that Jesus gives us His very body and blood along with bread and wine in Holy Communion¹, and that these are means by which He forgives our sins², strengthens us for daily living, and draws us into closer fellowship with Him and other believers. The Bible also teaches us to examine ourselves prior to receiving the meal³. For those receiving Holy Communion, examine yourself with these questions:

Do I believe that I am a sinner and am I sorry for my sins?

Do I believe that Jesus Christ is God's Son and my personal Savior?

Do I believe that Christ's true body and blood are present in this holy meal for my forgiveness?

Do I truly intend with the help of God to correct my sinful life?


Our Lord invites to His table those who trust His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes. Those who are not members of a Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod congregation and have not communed at Immanuel previously are asked to speak with a pastor prior to the service. Those who are of a different confession (i.e., church body)⁴ or are unsure about communing, are invited to come forward during distribution with their hands folded in prayer, or held close to the chest and receive a blessing.



¹³So now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; but the greatest of these is love.



And the people sought him and came to him, and would have kept him from leaving them, ⁴³but he said to them, "I must preach the good news of the kingdom of God to the other towns as well; for I was sent for this purpose." ⁴⁴And he was preaching in the synagogues of Judea.

Nicene Creed



Our offerings are placed on the altar as it is prepared for the Lord's Supper and the Offertory is sung








Preface

Communion Confession

- P The Lord's Supper is God's gift for Christians who are properly instructed. In communing, we want people to receive Christ's body and blood for their good. This means that as you come to the Lord's Table you affirm with each communicant that Jesus is your Savior and Lord; and with Lutheran Christians you confess:
- **C** I recognize and confess that I am a sinner. I repent of my sin and ask God's forgiveness.

I believe that Jesus Christ is my only Lord and Savior from sin, Satan and death.

I believe that the risen Christ is really present in the Sacrament and, under the form of the bread and wine, I receive His true body and blood for the forgiveness of my sins and the strengthening of my faith and life.

(Augsburg Confession – Article X)

I resolve to dedicate my life to the service of my Lord in His Body, the Church, by regular group worship, sacrificial giving, thankful living and sharing the Gospel with others. (*Romans* 12:1)


Consecration - The Words of Our Lord


